Bali Studio - Winter 2025

Do you have an interest in culture and art?

Would you like to escape the boundaries of the traditional classroom and try *experiential learning* where the lecture theatre may be in the Balinese temple, a Banjar (village hall), a Palace or heritage building in the centre of a provincial city?

Your experiences will be led by members of Balinese holy communities, internationally renowned contemporary artists and curators, revolutionaries and social justice reformists.

You will witness first-hand, eye surgery with the John Fawcett Foundation team and join in their educational program with primary school children.

After class you may socialize with your classmates and continue with group work and discussion on life, art and culture as you draw, practice Bahasa language skills, record thoughts in written reports and adjust the photographs and drawings you have made

The art instruction is aimed at introductory level, although the topics dealt with are consistent with second semester Level 1 and Level 2 units at UWA.

Regardless of your artistic skills and background you will be able to successfully complete the program if you have willingness to learn art processes and an interest in curiously observing and recording cultural experiences. Learning outcomes will be evaluated from your written, drawn, video and photographic recordings (Bahasa language group project)

The course cost is AU\$1,500 which includes accommodation, breakfast, group meals at opening and closing ceremonies, lunches most days, entry to cultural precincts, transport to cultural activities. Students will also be required to pay tuition fees for the UWA unit, either by HECs or upfront.

You will need to provide your own: Return airfares to and from Bali (\$700 if booked early) Hotel transfers (\$10 - 30 each way) Personal spending money (\$20 - 30 / day)

The study program is supported by Global Learning Grants (\$1,500) scholarships available to eligible students via Global Studio.

You will be required to participate in pre-departure lectures and workshops in June 2025

Toraja Enrichment And Cultural Heritage (TEACH)
Program

Bali Studio has a rich history including 17 years of development and 15 years of programs. In this time, we have developed strong working relationships with the Christian University Indonesia (UKI Toraja) in Tana Toraja, the *Land of the Heavenly Fathers*, home to one of the most unique cultures on earth. In 2025 UKI Toraja has offered 5 full scholarships for a Bali Studio extension program for a bespoke immersive language, culture and art program in which 8 lucky students will work with UKI Toraja students to visualize and record cultural experiences. The program will include workshops with artisans from world heritage listed villages (villagers), Toraja's famous coffee culture including growing, producing and marketing. Students will experience Torajan life, spend two nights sleeping in



Tongkonan. This is the traditional ancestral house, or <u>rumah adat</u>, of the <u>Torajan</u> people in <u>South Sulawesi</u>, <u>Indonesia</u>. Tongkonan has a distinguishing boat-shaped and oversized <u>saddleback roof</u>. (wiki)
